I am not far into the build of my ASW28 and I would appreciate any advice, critical or otherwise, on my progress.

So far I have fitted the rudder/elevator and retract servos and have them hooked up and working. I am waiting for some servo mounts to arrive for the Hitec 125mg aileron servos and the Hitec 85mg spoiler servos. I have also bought a 1/4 scale sliding window for the canopy and would like any advice on the best way to fit this. The cockpit has a basic dash board so I will also be adding to this and will be fitting a 1/4 scale pilot to the seat.

While I've been waiting for the servo mounts to arrive I have applied the decals which were pretty straight forward. They are of good quality and are applied by first laying a piece of clear slightly tacky vinyl over them and when you peel this back off it fetches the decals off their sheet. This then allows you to see exactly where your decals are going and whether they're straight or not. Probably all done this way now but it is the first time I have used this method. I have also just acquired an EagleTree Seagull glide system which I will be fitting to the 28, so if anyone has experience of this set-up I would like to pick your brains when I get it.



My buddy Darren gave it a healthy shove off and she just sailed away with only two clicks of up elevator needed. There was not much thermal activity but enough slope lift to get a good 20-25 minute flight.
I did not try any aero's, just basic circuits and fast passes which were faster than expected. I'll try rolls and loops next time out.
Landing was a non-event, as there is a very good landing area on top and with plenty of height I took her way back and just played with the spoilers until she settled down.
