Less of a build thread - more a Minimoa conversion Mainly for Idigbo (Ian) This is 1:3.5 scale from Chris's plan!

Top view: Cut the depth of rear spar for Flaps = 96mm from te of inner panel to le of new spar

View from under the panel, Top spar can be seen sunk in about 2/3rds with a capping strip 15mm wide consisting of 1/64th ply grain fore & aft laminated to 1/16th balsa grain span-wise, all glued and dried before cutting in from the bottom. Lower capping strip was 10mm wide to allow plenty of travel


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


Sorry Crash, I was a bit abrupt!



Vince,
Yes I've always brush painted on reg numbers, the few exceptions being non scale where I sometimes cut the numbers/designs from solartrim!

I use acad or whatever program is available, to scale and print out the design full-size then use carbon paper to transfer the lines to solartrim by hand, it leaves a feint ink deposit on the trim (plus


In the case of brush painting, carbon paper wont transfer to cellulose finish! I use the scalpel to cut out the corners of the letters, also cut the curves in sections leaving a small space to hold the paper in one piece. Tape the paper in place and use a sharp pencil to use the paper as a kind of stencil. take the paper off and join the spaces with a pencil.

Then I use an adjustable pen loaded with paint (humbrol matt black no 33) French curves, ruler and bendy curve thingy made by Faber-Castell (all available from places like Ham & Sewel, artists stuff). Can draw the lines in paint as thin as you like but better to have them slightly thicker, makes it easier to fill in after!

Once dry then fill in with a soft brush, the good thing about humbrol matt is that it flattens down (no brush marks) I leave it to dry in the shade gives longer chance to flatten! Humbrol gloss is not very good, shows brush marks and stays sticky too long.

I have good spray gear but always paint the numbers by hand because I would be frightened that paint would get under any masking tape, with high contrast numbers any imperfections would show up too much!

Must admit that humbrol matt does not get a perfect key on cellulose, hence the remark that I might give them a covering of satin varnish (never liked full gloss anything on a model, makes it look to plastic)


