Trevor, only done the 2.2m Parkzone Ka8 so far, but it doesn't even notice them.

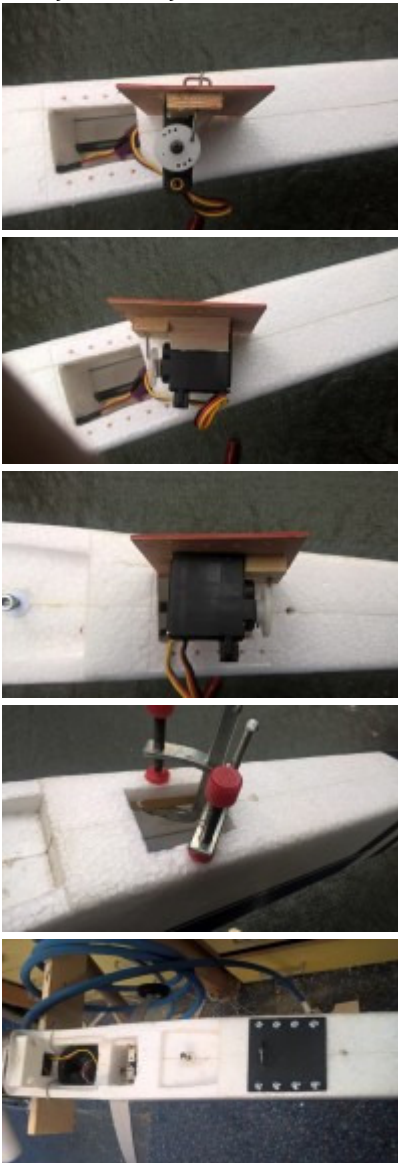

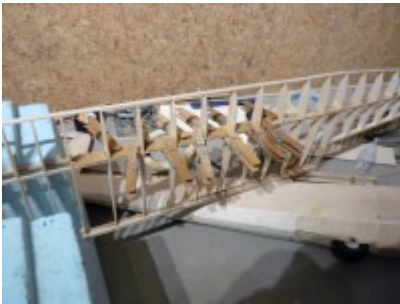
